**THE RUSSIAN AND ENGLISH CHARITY AFTER THE APRIL
UPRISING**

(Summary)

Plamen Bozhinov reviews "The Russian and English charity after the April Uprising". After a thorough analysis of the situation of the problem in the literature, the author starts to collect and interpret the documentary sources. He points out three periods, when with a varying intensity and accomplished results the Russian and British charity is put through after the defeat of the uprising. Special attention is paid to the activity of the Russian diplomat Kniaz Certelev, to the Slavonic charity committees in Russia and to Lady Strangford in Bulgaria. He reaches the conclusion that the funding that came from England is far greater compared to the support from Russia.
